Students should arrive in school for 8:25am as Form Time begins at 8:30am.

All Year 7 should use the Uplands entrance which is off Queens Drive. The gates at the Uplands Lane entrance are locked at 8:25am and students have to walk to the Mill Lane entrance and sign in late after this.

If students are late, they will have to attend a detention at break time. Two lates in a week will lead to an afterschool detention on Fridays.

Uniform & Equipment

All students must have the following equipment with them every day:

- Bag
- Pencil case
- Black pen
- Red pen
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Rubber
- Calculator

Please note that, mobile phones, smart watches, headphones and other electronic devices are banned from school. Students can bring them but they should not be used, seen or heard from the point the student arrives to when they leave. Any breaches of this rule will lead to confiscation and further sanctions up to and including detention and suspension.

Students must wear the following school uniform:

 - Black pleated knee length skirt
 - Black pinafore
 - Smart Black trousers (jeans, capri pants/chinos, leggings etc are not allowed)
- 2. Choice of:
 - Plain black V-neck jumper
 - Plain black V-neck cardigan
- 3. White shirt
- 4. Velcro or clip on Holly Lodge tie single colour for each year group as follows:

Yellow – Year 7 Red – Year 8 Green – Year 9 Blue – Year 10 Purple – Year 11

- 5. Plain black school shoes/trainers with no distinctive markings
- 6. Choice of:
 - Black socks
 - Black tights
- 7. Black blazer with Holly Lodge Girls' College badge
- 8. Plain waterproof black coat (leather, denim or fur coats/jackets are not allowed)
- 9. Hair bobbles HAIR MUST BE TIED BACK (black/white/tie colour only)
- 10. Optional Plain black scarf

Please Note:

- No make-up
- 1 set of stud earrings are allowed.
- Only natural hair colourings

Compulsory - PE Kit

- 1. Choice of black shorts, skort, tracksuit, jogging bottoms or leggings
- 2. Black training t-shirt or ¼ zip training top with school logo on
- 3. Black or white socks
- 4. Trainers

<u>ParentMail</u>

Communicating with parents is an important part of what we do here at Holly Lodge, making sure you get the correct information about activities, events and things that really matter is something we care about.

We use a ParentMail, a service used by over 6,000 schools, nurseries and children's clubs to communicate to parents. ParentMail will be beneficial to you because you can:

- Use a free mobile app on Android and iOS to pick up school messages instantly.
- Top up dinner money or pay for school trips/items in just a few taps.
- Complete forms, give consent/permissions and give feedback on surveys.
- And much, much more!

Registering with ParentMail is very easy! Before your daughter joins us, you will be sent either an email and/or text message from ParentMail, when you receive this please just follow the instructions in the message. Please be assured that ParentMail is registered with the Information Commissioner and guarantees that all information you provide will be kept private and will not be passed on to any other organisation.

Once registered, if you have an Android or Apple smartphone, we highly recommend you download the **ParentMail App for the best user experience**. To do this, simply search for "ParentMail" in your App store.

In addition to communicating with parents, we also use ParentMail for payment of school meals, trips and other resources available to students throughout the year.

Cashless Catering & Biometrics

We operate a cashless catering system in school so that money does not exchange hands at the service area and purchases of school dinners, snacks and beverages is electronic using biometric registration and recognition system. Once registered with ParentMail [see above], parents can create their catering account and upload money to it as they wish. As no money changes hands, students do not have to carry cash around school, parents do not need to give children cash to take to school for lunches and are instead encouraged to keep their child's cashless catering account topped up automatically using the ParentMail system by debit card or credit card online. This gives parents peace of mind that dinner money is safe and being used for that purpose.

The system provides us with a more efficient, faster and ultimately better quality of service. It incorporates the latest biometric technology and eliminates the need for pupils to carry cash throughout the day, reducing the risk of bullying.

Please be assured that a fingerprint is not stored, a reference of a small number of points on the finger is scanned, converted into a code and the next time the child's finger is scanned it simply checks that the same points are in the same places, the details cannot be extracted or used for any other purpose.

There are obvious safeguarding benefits and efficiency at the food serving points as no money changes hands, students do not have to carry cash around school, parents do not need to give children cash to take to school for lunches (and school trips) and are instead encouraged to keep their child's cashless catering account topped up automatically using the Parent Pay system by debit card or credit card online. This gives you peace of mind that dinner money is safe and being used for that purpose, school trip money is safe and used only for the payment of school trips (when indicated).

A daily 'spend limit' of £5 will be programmed into the system for all students. This can be increased or decreased for an individual student by making a written request to the kitchen manager.

Biometric Registration

For Cashless Catering purposes students are registered with a biometric finger scan used to identify their account at the till. Biometric registration does not store fingerprints but translates it into a set of encrypted code, a unique digitally encrypted biometric code, to identify each students' cashless catering account at our catering tills. Each student has their own cashless catering account registered to them, operated using their finger or thumb at the catering tills (biometric recognition).

Biometric Consent is sought from parents in the Data Collection Sheet during the enrolment process. Please complete the Data Collection Sheet in your welcome pack in full on both sides and return it to school.

All Biometric data is stored securely in compliance with the Data Protection Act 1998 and General Data Protection Regulation 2018 and is not transferred, shared, accessed, used or stored for any other purpose than cashless catering (school dinners).

Student biometric data is deleted when a student leaves Holly Lodge Girls' College.

Free School Meals

We are aware that a number of parents who may be eligible to claim for Free School Meals for their daughter do not submit a claim to the local authority.

If you are receiving one of the following benefits, a FREE tasty and nutritious school meal is available for your child at Holly Lodge...BUT YOU MUST APPLY!

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income (as assessed by HM Revenue & Customs) that does not exceed £16,190

• Working Tax Credit 'run-on' - the payment someone may receive for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Universal Credit

Look at the benefits of applying for Free School Meals:

- A free school meal for your child, which is good for their health and could help their learning.
- Savings for you, worth over £350 a year.
- Extra money for the school through Pupil Premium, worth at least £900 a year.

Remember, just registering your child for Free School Meals means that Holly Lodge receives the extra money even if you don't take up the free meal. No one will know you have registered and it will not affect any other benefits you are claiming.

Bus Pass

Children up to age 16 may be entitled to subsidised transport, depending on the distance from home to school and if they meet certain eligibility criteria.

Compulsory school age pupils who are resident in Liverpool will be classed as eligible children if they:

- attend their nearest suitable qualifying school and meet the qualifying distance criteria, for children aged eight or over the qualifying distance is 3 miles or more; OR
- are from a low-income group family, low income groups as those who are entitled to free school meals, or whose families are in receipt of the maximum level of Working Tax Credit

We would urge you to read the Home to School Transport Policy for Compulsory School Age Pupils Academic Year 2022/23, which can be found on the Liverpool City Council website before making an application.
